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



BY PLANE:

10 km from the city centre, Brussels South Charleroi Airport is the 2nd leading national airport, acknowledged for its on-time performance and the quality of the services on offer.

Charleroi city centre can be reached from the airport with the shuttle bus (line A), which runs every 30 minutes during the week and once an hour at the weekend.



BY TRAIN:

Charleroi South Station is accessible from all the main Belgian railway stations and all major European cities, with a connection at Brussels-Midi. Located in the city centre, the station is the ideal starting point for discovering the city.

BY BUS:

Towns and cities in the Charleroi Region are accessible by bus from the railway station in the city centre.



BY ROAD:

Charleroi is located at the intersection of the E42 (Mons-Liège) and A54 (Charleroi-Brussels) motorways. The city can also be reached via the main Charleroi ring road (R3) and the N90 (Liege-Namur-Charleroi-Mons) and N5 (Charleville-Mézières-Charleroi-Brussels) national roads.

STREET ART

At the heart of "underground" Charleroi

Charleroi has been reinventing itself over the last few years thanks to a constant flow of cultural and artistic activities, absolutely contemporary in its modes of expression: graffiti, sculptures, collages, stencils, mosaics...

A variety reflecting the concept of urban art.

Street art no longer focuses solely on the aspirations of the counterculture; it now has a fun-orientated relationship with the city, making its mark thanks to events, such as Asphalte, Couleurs Charleroi, Urban Dream and Public Art, whose colourful features are very much apparent in Charleroi!

Set off to discover this hiking or metroaccessible quirky artistic heritage, spread out along a trail in the city centre or along the banks of the river Sambre.

THE "CITY CENTRE STREET ART" TRAIL

In 2014, international Street Art stars arrived in Charleroi to take part in the 1st biennial Asphalte urban art event. The majority of the frescoes created at the time can still be seen today. These monumental works are joined by new paintings and graffiti by local artists who let their talent speak for itself on the free-expression walls.

On the banks of the Sambre

THE "STREET ART ON THE BANKS OF THE SAMBRE" TRAIL

Take part in this offbeat walk: hop on a metro train and return on foot along the towpath. Looking out of the window, you will discover an industrial setting, worthy of the paintings by Pierre Paulus, the eulogist of the Black Country, and nature taking over again: the huge ironworks on the banks of the Sambre, the various slag heaps growing greener and greener... The return journey to Charleroi can be made on foot, along the towpath. Hikers will reach Charleroi South Station by passing through Charleroi's industrial environment while admiring the graffiti-covered walls.



ART NOUVEAU

A few buildings worth mentioning

A military fortress for two centuries, Charleroi lost its fortifications around 1870 to allow the city to expand, while boulevards were built on the ramparts.

At the beginning of the 20th century, a new residential area took shape, occupied mainly by members of the bourgeois class resulting from the booming iron, glass and coal industries. Anxious to enjoy a comfortable lifestyle and show off their new status, they built luxurious residences, as a symbol of their newfound success.

Against this background, Art Nouveau found an environment conducive to its development, leaving its mark on the city's architectural landscape: wrought iron balconies and railings, sgraffiti, decorative art features...

GOLDEN HOUSE (MAISON DORÉE)

Built by Alfred Frère in 1899 for a wealthy glass manufacturer, this building now houses the Charleroi Press Centre. Its facade features a variety of colours thanks to the use of colourful bricks and golden sgraffito (hence its name).

DOCTORS' HOUSE (MAISON DES MÉDECINS)

Created in 1908 and granted listed status in 1994, the Doctors' House is indicative of the aim of confirming a certain degree of social well-being. Its facade displays a harmonious polychrome blend of various materials, combining bricks of different colours, stone, wood, metal, bas-reliefs and stained-glass windows.

MAISON LAFLEUR

This 1908 dwelling was the first Art Nouveaulisted dwelling in Charleroi, in 1989. Tall and erect, this building is notable for its understated appearance, its overall design reminiscent of the "Viennese Secession" movement, its trapezoidal windows and a particular geometrical arrangement in the ornamental work.

The two decades, from 1920 to 1940, saw the emergence of a major social turning point. Society was changing, technological progress and industrialisation revolutionised working practices and resulted in new ways of living. Architects sought to cater for the requirements of all sections of society, deploying new techniques, such as reinforced concrete to help save on the construction costs. Life for the working class was steadily improving, while members of the bourgeois class were starting to leave the city centre for greener outlying districts.

Apart from several talented architects such as Léon Coton, Maurice Hosdain and many others, three towering figures left indelible marks on the urban landscape during this period: Marcel Leborgne, Joseph André and Marcel Depelsenaire.

CITY HALL

This Art Deco masterpiece by Jules Cézar and Joseph André was inaugurated in 1936.

DE HEUG PIANOS

Situated along the quayside, this renovated building is one of the architect Leborgne's greatest works, with its highly artificial volumes, its sleek lines, an omnipresent curve in the façade and a vertical structure defined by the column with the stairwell and its large windows.

RAILWAY HOTEL

The many windows creating a glass border and the horizontal appearance of the entire Paul Nouille-built structure are inevitably evocative of trains and speed.









Comic books

Charleroi is regarded as one of the birthplaces of Belgian comic books.

The "Marcinelle School" is a comic book style associated with the magazine Spirou. Its distinguishing features include a dark line and round bubbles as opposed to the "Brussels School", associated with the magazine Tintin, where the emphasis is on a clear line style of drawing.

The first Dupuis publishing house albums were printed in 1965. Franquin, Morris, Jijé, three authors forming the basis for the Marcinelle school. Over 200 comic book authors and internationally renowned characters such as Spirou, Tif & Tondu, Boule & Bill, Lucky Luke, Buck Danny, the Smurfs, Natacha, Gaston, Yoko Tsuno, Papyrus, the Blue Tunics, Mélusine, Cédric, Largo Winch... are now part of the great Dupuis family.











THE PARK METRO STATION, located along Queen Astrid Park, is dedicated to Lucky Luke's, the world's most famous cowboy.

A must-see: the station's cactus-shaped lampposts, the wall mosaics in reference to desert flora and the panels dedicated to our hero and the other characters in the series, Billy the Kid, the Daltons, Rantanplan...

Entrance : rue Willy Ernst.

JANSON METRO STATION is dedicated entirely to the Dupuis publishing house and its characters: Spirou and Fantasio, the Smurfs, Natacha, Agent 212, Gaston...

Entrances: boulevard Paul Janson – boulevard Zoé Drion.

PALAIS DU BAS

Here you will find everything related to comics and other comics-inspired art forms: figurative, narrative, urban, pop art or neo pop. This gallery dedicated to the 9th Art hosts temporary exhibitions and is a true meeting place for collectors of rare objects.

DREAMWALL AND KEYWALL STUDIOS

The Dupuis publishing house has kept pace with new technologies. The animation and graphic design studio DreamWall is world-renowned for its productions, the most famous being "Asterix, the domain of the gods". The Keywall multi-studio system allows programmes to be recorded using virtual sets. Studio 1 alone has 200 m² of greenkey space and is considered to be the largest real-time virtual studio in Europe.



MUSÉE DES BEAUX-ARTS

FROM MAGRITTE TO PAULUS...

The Fine Arts Museum bears witness to the artistic past – 19th and 20th centuries – and present of Charleroi and its region, the Hainaut basin and, more generally, Wallonia.

A huge collection of paintings, sculptures, prints, drawings, photographs, ceramics, videos and installations, the collection is based on the works of artists connected to the region by virtue of their birth, life, work or inspiration: René Magritte, Pierre Paulus, Alphonse Darville, François-Joseph Navez...

The museum also focuses on contemporary artists who, in one way or another, refer to this region and to the major present-day societal and human concerns.



CONTEMPORARY ART

BPS22

HAINAUT PROVINCE ART MUSEUM Housed in a neo-classical-fronted glass industrial hall, built during the 1911 industrial exhibition, the art museum holds temporary exhibitions.

The venue has retained its distinctiveness and its industrial splendour: the large 12-metre-high hall features wide windows and lends itself well to monumental installations. A second hall, a white box-type hall, provides a more modernist space.

LE BOIS DU CAZIER

A COMBINATION OF COAL, IRON AND GLASS

Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the former mining site has three museum areas.

Through films, photographs and personal accounts, L'Espace 8 août 1956 provides an insight into the symbolic aspects of the mining disaster and immigration.

The Industry Museum shows the Industrial Revolution through its main fields of activity and evokes the status of the working class.

The Glass Museum has both an archaeological and a contemporary collection. The visit is topped off with a glass-blowing workshop.

Featuring two headframes, this magnificent architectural entity is surrounded by three slag heaps, which have been converted into footpaths. At the top, a landscape observatory offers a 360° panoramic view of the surrounding landscape.

POTTERY CENTRE

AGE-OLD SKILLS AND KNOW-HOW

Famous for centuries for its glazed stoneware sold all over the world, the village of Bouffioulx owes its reputation to the distinctive features of its stoneware – hard, impermeable, opaque and reflecting sound – as well as its high-temperature firing (from 1250 to 1350°C) and the addition of sea salt, which is thrown into the kiln during the firing process.

Situated in the middle of the village, the Pottery Centre pays homage to the potters of then and now. Visitors are invited to discover their techniques, their expertise in the use of earth, water and fire, through a special layout to illustrate the major changes in industrial sectors based on high-quality craftsmanship.

BOUFFIOULX, POTTERY VALLEY

Dubois and Lardinois, two potter's workshops keeping the tradition alive today.

Housed under the porch of Trésignies barracks, a listed monument, the museum offers a panoramic view of our history through 12 light infantry regiments from 1830 to the present day.

Different rooms displaying uniforms to illustrate how light infantry troops have helped to recover or maintain freedom, from the 1830 Revolution to the operations in the former Yugoslavia.

TRADITIONAL MARCHES OF THE ENTRE-SAMBRE-ET-MEUSE REGION MUSEUM

Originating in the Middle Ages, the traditional marches have continued to adapt to important and historical periods that have marked the Entre-Sambre-et-Meuse region.

It was in 1801 that armed forces began to wear uniforms during religious processions and parades in honour of the patron saint of the villages. The museum presents a variety of costumes, hats and plumes from the 1st and 2nd Empires.

CHARLEROI, FOUR HISTORICAL SITES

BELFRY, RELIEF PLAN, WELLS AND UNDERGROUND PASSAGES AT THE FORTRESS

1666, the creation of a fortress

Founded during the military turmoil that erupted between the Spanish Netherlands and France, the city owes its name to Charles II, King of Spain, who was placed on the throne at the age of four following the death of his father, Philip IV.

It was on 3 September 1666 that the Marquis de Castel Rodrigo, Governor General of the Netherlands, laid the first stone of the future fortified site: Charleroy. It was then abandoned by the Spaniards. Louis XIV took control of the city and commissioned Vauban to rebuild the fortress and improve its defences.

Place Charles II now reflects the city's military past: nine streets start from the centre of the square.

FOUR HISTORICAL SITES HAVE BEEN EXCEPTIONALLY OPEN TO THE PUBLIC EVER SINCE THE 350TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION, IN 2016, OF THE CITY'S FOUNDATION.

BELFRY

A symbol of civil rights and the power of cities, the Charleroi Belfry, a magnificent Art Deco-style building, is made from blue and white stone and special bricks and topped with a bronze pinnacle.

The 272 steps lead up to a 47-bell carillon and a 360° panoramic view from the four balconies. Orientation tables will guide you during your visual explorations of the surrounding landscape. This monument is included on the UNESCO World Heritage List.

RELIEF MAP

A huge scale model of the Charleroi fortress is on display in one of the city hall rooms. It is an exact replica of the model that Louis XIV commissioned and was once available for visitors to admire in the large gallery in the Louvre and is now kept in the Lille Fine Arts Museum.

THE WELL OF THE FRENCH FORTRESS

A trip down into the underground passages on place Charles II brings you face to face with the rare remains of the Vauban fortress, dating from 1667.

The scenic design offers a detailed history of the square as well as the city's long history of water-related problems.

THE UNDERGROUND PASSAGES OF THE DUTCH FORTRESS

The underground passages of the old fortress are bound to arouse your curiosity.

Invested with a scenic design, the 150 metres of galleries are open for guided tours.









CHARLEROI CITY HALL AND ITS BELFRY

Inaugurated in 1936, Charleroi City Hall is an exceptional Art Deco building from every perspective.

The use of the finest materials, the impressive Belfry, a UNESCO-listed World Heritage Site, the masterpieces that decorate the halls and corridors and the monumental form of the structure – these are all typical features of this architectural style.

The entrance hall, the grand staircase, the central well and the council room are a testimony to the talent of the architect, Joseph André, who, together with various Belgian artists, contributed to the building's prestige and elegance.

Every 15 minutes, the Belfry's carillon used to play a few bars of popular songs by the Charleroi chansonnier Jacques Bertrand.

THE CHURCH OF ST. CHRISTOPHER

Initially a royal chapel dedicated to St Louis, built in 1667 at the behest of Louis XIV for his garrison, it was converted in 1722 and dedicated to the worship of St Christopher.

All that remains of this building are the choir, the apse and the facade, which now enjoy listed status.

The building was covered with an impressive copper dome after the Second World War.

In 1956, the architect Joseph André provided it with a lavish glass mosaic. A one-of-a-kind achievement in Belgium, produced by the Venetian masters working for the Orsoni company and based on drawings by Jean Ransy, this work represents the Apocalypse according to the St. John.

L'ALBA

MAISON DES TALENTS PARTAGÉS (HOUSE OF SHARED TALENTS) Built in 1877 for Jules Audent, one of the first mayors of Charleroi, this magnificent building may well be one of the first houses built on the new boulevards in the 19th century.

Designed for receptions and official representations, Audent House has the character of a private mansion house. Its special features include a large number of voluminous rooms, the size of the spaces, their layout and the well-preserved condition of the building.

Occupied by the Italian Consulate for almost 50 years, the building has now become a forum for culture, exchanges and artists' residencies, thanks to the efforts of the singer Melanie de Biasio.

The Alba, Maison des Talents Partagés (House of Shared Talents) is a multidisciplinary platform for creation, dissemination and artistic development to enable artists to forge links, produce new works and hone their skills. The venue is open to both visiting artists and the general public.

MAGRITTE AT CHÂTELET

"THIS IS NOT AN HOMAGE"

The surrealist painter René Magritte spent his youth in Châtelet from 1904 to 1917. The painter has now become the focus of a walk through the city centre and a visit to his childhood home.

THE MAGRITTE WALK

Located in the pedestrian area of the city centre, the walk is a historical and artistic reminder of the painter's stay in Châtelet. Ground inlays and works by different artists are on display all along the route.

MAGRITTE'S CHILDHOOD HOME

Along the route, visitors will discover the Art Nouveau- style mansion, built in 1911 at the request of Magritte's father. The painter spent his early years in this beautiful, lavish residence. The interior architecture is still the same as it was when the artist lived there, with parquet floors, balustraded columns and two magnificent fireplaces. The kitchen walls are completely covered with now unobtainable Bouffioulx earthenware, which makes this room an exceptional space.



TRAZEGNIES CASTLE

AN IMPRESSIVE REMINDER OF BELGIUM'S FEUDAL PAST

The Trazegnies family owned a castle worthy befitting its name. The Romanesque cellars, rare reminders of the 11th century.

The entire castle was rebuilt at the end of the 16th century, after being ransacked and burnt down in 1554. During reconstruction work, Charles II, Marquis of Trazegnies, commissioned the construction of this superb main building, the real highlight of the present-day castle and an almost unique example in Belgium of Louis XIII Renaissance style architecture.

Listed as a historical monument in 1950, the castle features paintings and sculptures by Jean Ransy, Albert Mascaux, Charles Delporte and others in its various rooms.

The castle courtyard contains an admirable plane tree which the Marquis of Trazegnies had planted there on 7 November 1735.

Officially recognised as the finest specimen in Belgium, it has a girth of 4.60 m and a height of 44 m.

FORMER SOLEILMONT ABBEY

RELIGIOUS REMNANTS AND ENGLISH-STYLE GARDENS

This abbey is said to have been founded in the 11th century. After a long period of prosperity, the abbey saw its survival endangered by periods of war and epidemics. The abbey was given a new lease of life after the French Revolution when the buildings were restored or rebuilt.

Soleilmont Abbey was destroyed by a devastating fire on Christmas Eve in 1963. Priceless treasures were destroyed: statues, relics, precious objects... The nuns moved to a new abbey in 1973 while the old site was sold to private individuals.

The most interesting remains today – the remnants of the church, the cloister, the abbesses' tombstones and the main building (abbey house) – are part of an 89-are site developed and operated by the non-profit organisation "Ancienne Abbaye de Soleilmont". "English" gardens featuring several collections of outstanding plants and trees serve as a setting for the tombstones, the cloister, and the 12th century pointed window of the Our Lady of Rome chapel.

URBAN VIBE IN CHARLEROI

A route reflecting 350 years of history

The route forms a 21-point loop signposted with arrows and hexagonal plaques evoking the shape of Charleroi's fortress. This route takes the visitor from station to station to discover the metropolitan area's past and its must-see sites such as the Belfry, City Hall, Art Nouveau houses...

Art Nouveau route

At the beginning of the 20th century, a new residential area took shape, occupied mainly by members of the bourgeois class resulting from the booming iron, glass and coal industries. Anxious to enjoy a comfortable lifestyle and show off their new status, they built luxurious residences, as a symbol of their newfound success. Against this background, Art Nouveau found an environment conducive to its development, leaving its mark on the city's architectural landscape.

Art Deco route

The two decades, from 1920 to 1940, saw the emergence of a major social turning point. Society was changing, technological progress and industrialisation revolutionised working practices and resulted in new ways of living. Architects sought to cater for the requirements of all sections of society, deploying new techniques, such as reinforced concrete to help save on the construction costs. Apart from several talented architects such as Léon Coton, Maurice Hosdain and many others, three towering figures left indelible marks on the urban landscape during this period: Marcel Leborgne, Joseph André and Marcel Depelsenaire.

Street Art tour in the city centre

In 2014, international Street Art stars arrived in Charleroi to take part in the 1st biennial Asphalte urban art event. The majority of the frescoes created at the time can still be seen today. These monumental works are joined by new paintings and graffiti by local artists who let their talent speak for itself on the free-expression walls.

Street Art - Porte Ouest overhead metro line

Seriously quirky, this tour is a godsend for people keen on unusual photographs and other urban explorers. The Charleroi-Marchienne journey by overhead metro introduces you to an impressive industrial heritage embellished by the world of Street Art.

The outward journey is made by metro from the South Station, the return journey on foot along the towpath.

Downtown route

Following the downtown area's recent spectacular urban makeover new names are now being heard, such as Rive Gauche, Quai10, and the Manufacture Urbaine (LaM.U). This tour along the river Sambre will help you discover the less well-known features of the citv's history.

Facades and their hidden treasures

Armed with a booklet during their 11-stage tour, pint-sized hunters will have the opportunity to discover the treasures hidden in the city of Charleroi's facades in the form of a game. Page after page, it's all about looking for the intruder, looking for details in the facades, linking words to photos.

At the end of the tour, a surprise awaits the hunters at the Maison du Tourisme.

This is not black

This route leads you through the city centre to revive memories of Charleroi's social and industrial history. The trail relies on historical facts and anecdotes to guide you through the city, evoking social struggles, successive waves of immigration, leading figures that dominated its history and buildings which today make it the leading metropolitan area in Wallonia.

Magritte route in Châtelet

Located in the city centre pedestrian area, the Magritte walk is a historical and artistic reminder of René Magritte's stay in Châtelet where he spent his youth, from 1904 to 1917. Ground inlays and works by different artists are featured all along the route: Evelyne Lemaire, Charles De Rouck, Alphonse Darville, Léon Moisse and Jean-Michel Folon.

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NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

SIGNPOSTED ROUTES IN THE DISTRICTS OF CHARLEROI

Fontaine-qui-Bout at Marcinelle

This 3.4-km route, signposted with green rectangles, takes hikers to unexpected landscapes in the highly urbanised and industrialised Charleroi region: a forest area, a bocage landscape, a standard tree orchard, a rural district and ponds. The north side of the Fontaine-qui-Bout stream valley provides an uninterrupted view of the Bois de Prince forest area.

Bois du Prince Forest at Marcinelle

This 4- km walk, signposted with red rectangles, passes by the Saracen cave, a Natura 2000 site that is used as a bat refuge. At the Knight Templars' site, where archaeological digs take place, visitors will discover its history mingled with local legends. The natural environment is full of discoveries: the reappearance of a stream, a forest pool and the wealth of geological varieties.

Heigne Forest at Jumet

The 5.8-km walk, signposted with red rectangles, starts in the former municipality of Roux and mainly crosses the town of Jumet, whose multifaceted landscape still reflects the prosperity of the coal and glass industries. The route follows the canal towpath, the RAVeL network of greenways, Heigne Forest and its slag heaps. The historical legacy includes Bivort Park, Heigne chapel, the old collieries and the stone commemorating the workers' struggles of 1886.

Between Roche and Eure and the Brun Chêne Nature Reserve at Mont-sur-Marchienne and Montigny-le-Tilleul

Two routes in one offering an almost-4-km circuit signposted with red rectangles and a more modest 1-km circuit signposted with blue rectangles in the Brun Chêne Nature Reserve. A delightful walking tour, delving into an eventful geological past, on the wooded banks of the Eau d'Heure Lakes, through a peaceful bocage, a limestone hill and its former quarry.

SIGNPOSTED ROUTES AT AISEAU-PRESLES

Pont-de-Loup, Presles and Roselies, boasting typical, well-defined stone-built houses Situated along the Biesme Valley, they offer peaceful, scenic landscapes and walking tours filled with impressive hedges

Walking tour at Aiseau

This 10-km route, signposted with red diamonds, follows tiny paths through this charming village to reach the Ferme des Castors, Oignies Abbey and its park, the Zeulies and Vantelle woods. The Oignies ponds are real treasures. Created by the abbey's monks in the 13th century, they were used for fish farming and a reservoir in case of water shortages to supply the flour mill.

Walking tour at Roselies

This 8.5-km route, signposted with blue diamonds, leads you to the river Sambre and the Roselies lock, at the site of the water treatment plant and the 15th century Albart Farm.

Walking tour at Pont-de-Loup

This 9.5-km route, signposted with yellow diamonds, will introduce you to an old Romanesque tower, the so-called miraculous spring of Notre-Dame-Del-Manock and Broue Forest.

Walking tour at Presles

The 13.5-km walk, signposted with green diamonds, starts at La Drève and leads you through neighbourhoods with charming old stone-built houses. Small chapels are waiting to be discovered along the path. Visitors will pass through the 16th century Ferme des Golias, the village centre and Biesme bridge, near the castle of the Counts of Oultremont and through the Fond Coupe-Gueule woods. The property of the family of the Counts of Oultremont for four centuries, the castle park opens its doors to the public once a year for daffodil-picking.





WALKING TOURS AT FLEURUS

The Fleurus Municipal Tourist Office offers visitors the opportunity to discover the entity via various themed or specific tours.

Old Fleurus, along the streets and alleys

The town of Fleurus is known for its long and turbulent past, where smaller and larger historical events converge, often during the course of a battle. Generally speaking, while History (with a capital H) is fairly well known, local people and visitors alike find that the History of the City itself remains a mystery combining the true and false, real life and legend. This 3-km hiking tour is an opportunity for you to discover the town and its changes over the course of time.

Saint-Amand, the battle of 16 June 1815

This roughly 10-km-long hiking and mountain bike tour around the village will introduce you to the positions held by the French and Prussian troops in 1815.

Industrial route, from Fleurus to Roux

Starting from the Forêt des Loisirs, this cycling route (12 km) helps you to discover the world of glassmaking and mining. Here and there you can still see an old factory, an old glass factory site, a railway station, a church, a chapel, a school, a park and many other reminders of Charleroi's rich industrial legacy.

The Forêt des Loisirs routes

Pay a visit to this splendid 65-hectare estate to enjoy the pleasures of the natural world in the midst of a peaceful setting. Thirteen routes (walking, horse-riding, cycling or a combination), whose lengths vary between 1.5 km and 8 km, will help you discover the Forêt des Loisirs, the place to be for Fleurus tourism. Also featuring playgrounds, a shaded barbecue area is accessible free of charge.

WALKING AT GERPINNES

At the heart of Gerpinnes – "Back to the roots".

This short 2.5 km walking tour leads you through streets and alleys to discover old houses, fountains and monuments. A return to the roots, from the Gallo-Roman past to the industrial epoch.

Around Gerpinnes -

"From Roman times to the present day".
Enjoy this hilly walking tour, among stunning landscapes and breath-taking views, passing through rocky country lanes, peaceful village roads and grassy paths to arrive near the Roman villa, the real birthplace of Gerpinnes.

Around Flaches -

"In the footsteps of the Knights Templar".
Starting from the Gerpinnes-Flaches church, this 6-km hiking tour travels through the woods and the Bertransart district to the farm of the same name, former Templar base. On the way back, hikers follow a country lane running through St Pierre Brook Valley.

At Gougnies-Villers – "The industrial past".

Along the paths, streets and alleys of the villages of Gougnies and Villers-Poterie, you will discover their industrial past (marble quarry, pottery factory...) as well as various natural sites, including the prestigious Chêne Sainte-Rolende.



Pavs d'Acoz -

"Three bell-towers walking tour".

This 7-km walking route links Acoz Church to Lausprelle via Acoz Castle and the village of Joncret. On the way back, you will pass through a scenic country lane used by the St. Rolende Procession every Whit Monday.

The Tournibus -

"Between the natural and rural environments".

This nigh-on 10 km-long route starts in Fromiée travelling almost only roads and forest paths in Tournibus Forest. A visit to Place d'Hymiée is well worth the effort.

Loverval -

"Discovering Art Deco".

This 6 km walking tour leads you to the Namèche orchard and the Bois de Loverval, where you will find the Saracens' Cave and the Leisure Centre of Marcinelle with its great lakes, its outdoor swimming pool and its health trails.

St. Rolende Tour

Starting from Place des Combattants, this 35-km trek takes you through the local villages, following in the footsteps of St. Rolende. After passing through the streets and alleys of Gerpinnes, you will cross the villages of Hymiée, Hanzinne, Tarciennes, Les Flaches, Joncret, Acoz, Villers-Poterie, Gougnies and Fromiée to finally return to Gerpinnes, like a real Entre-Sambre-et-Meuse hiker!





WALKING TOURS IN LES BONS VILLERS

Scenic villages, historical sights, rural landscapes and pastoral scenery are a sample of what is on offer in this selection of tours...

"L'encloître" route

This route introduces you to the southern part of Frasnes-lez-Gosselies and its rich heritage: St. Nicolas Parish Church, the Alderman's Chamber and the chapel of Notre-Dame du Roux.

"Le Pierpont" route

Setting out from the Chapel of Notre-Dame du Roux, this route introduces you to the other part of Frasnes-lez-Gosselies as far as Grand Pierpont Farm, now a hotel-restaurant and golf club.

"Les Hameaux" route

This rural tour will introduce you to the different hamlets in the village of Rèves featuring the castle tower, St Rémy's Church and some of the local farms

"Les Fermes" route

Lined with various farms, this rural walking tour will introduce you to the hamlet of Sart-à-Rèves.

"La Bruyère" route

This walking tour through the village of Villers-Perwin boasts a number of heritage sites, including a brick-built presbytery dating from the 17th century and listed as a Belgian Monumental Heritage Site.

"Les Chapelles" route

This trail will help you to discover the Mellet's rich heritage, thanks in particular to the various chapels spread out along this several kilometres long route.

"Les Fouilles" route

During this walking tour through the fields, your discover remnants of the Roman Vicus of Geminiacum, a Roman road that was used for centuries by the legions of the Roman Empire.

"La Taravisée" route

Bearing the name of a farm located in the village of Wayaux, this walking tour will introduce you to various chapels as well as Tourelle Farm, a magnificent 17th century brick farmhouse listed as a Walloon Monumental Heritage site.

WALKING TOURS AT PONT-À-CELLES

Thiméon tour

Located just north of the motorway to Wallonia, the village of Thiméon boasts a local feature included in UNESCO's Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity list: the Terre al'danse. The 6-km walking tour is an opportunity to discover two listed buildings: the Village House and Bishop's Palace Farm.

Rosseignies and Petit-Roeulx

This 7.5-km walking tour is an opportunity to discover the countryside around the village of Rosseignies and its splendid Our Lady of Charity Chapel. It also crosses the centre of the delightful village of Petit-Roeulx (Seneffe) and its splendid St Martin's Church.

From Obaix to Rosseignies via the Scheldt – Meuse ridge line


The former municipality of Obaix lies between the Meuse and Scheldt catchment areas. This 6-km long walking tour is an opportunity to explore the municipality's agricultural features (fields as far as the eye can see), and to appreciate the magnificent two rows of trees that run along the main route between the two villages and the wind farm.

From farm to farm around Buzet

The former municipalities of Obaix and Buzet share the Obaix-Buzet SNCB (National Railways) stopping point, but they also share a single built-up area. The 8.6-km walking tour on offer runs along country lanes and paths through and around this agglomeration and features several outstanding farmhouses.

From Liberchies to Odoumont

Starting from Place de Liberchies, an outstanding architectural complex featuring a monument in tribute to Django Reinhardt, this 8-km walking tour continues across the fields after passing along the picturesque La Houssière Farm. The tour then makes a detour through the hamlets of Odoumont (Les Bons Villers) and Fromiée along the Rampe.



Pont-à-Celles across fields

This 10-km walking tour starting from the centre of Pont-à-Celles, travelling along country lanes and paths, paints a varied picture of the local landscape. You will discover the major features of the town: impressive farms, chapels, water tower, Bois de Courriaulx...

From Hairiamont to Biernimont

This 8-km walking tour located north of the Charleroi-Brussels canal is an opportunity to discover the hamlets of Hairiamont and Biernimont by crossing our splendid countryside via farm tracks, footpaths and the RAVeL network of greenways.

Viesville, Manants Forest and Nature Reserve

Viesville is the greenest village in the municipality. Starting from the old railway station, the 7-km walking tour is an opportunity to cross the municipal Manants Forest, to discover the Viesville lock on the Charleroi-Brussels canal, to join the RAVeL network of greenways and to walk along the Nature Reserve.

Luttre and Viesville

Starting from the Champion car park in Luttre, this walking tour takes you through the village of Luttre and along the Rampe, Liberchies and Natry rivers. Arriving in Viesville, you will discover St. George's Church. You next pass by the old Ployt Farm on your way back via the RAVeL network of greenways.

SLAGHEADS

ONCE UPON A TIME BLACK-COLOURED SITE, OWING TO THE COAL-MINING ACTIVITIES THERE, THE ARTIFICIAL HILLS CREATED FROM THE FORMER SLAGHEAPS ARE NOW TRULY GREEN OASES IN THE CHARLEROI LANDSCAPE, STEEPED IN HISTORY AND RICH IN SOCIALLY RELEVANT VALUES.





SOME OPEN-ACCESS SLAGHEAPS...

Martinet Slagheaps at Roux

The large Martinet slag heap offers a wide range of original and varied biotopes to be discovered along its many walking trails. This impressive 53-hectare industrial wasteland has been colonised by sometimesrare wild species. Plantings of noble species and ponds are located alongside avec open areas containing pioneer species. The site is now also home to the brewing facilities of the Manufacture Urbaine and the Bread Centre of Excellence (forthcoming).

Access via Place Frédéric.

Terril des Vallées at Gilly

Close to Gilly velodrome, this slag heap has been adapted for mountain biking. At the top, the variety of slopes and southern flank orientations is conducive to biotopes as varied as they rich in biodiversity. Partly reforested on its northern flank, the slag heap is a riot of glorious colours in autumn.

Access via rue des Grandes Vallées.

Bayemont/Saint-Charles slag heap at Marchienne-au-Pont

The Bayemont slag heap was created as a result of the mining activities in shaft no. 18 of the Monceau-Fontaine collieries, which was located in the Rue des Réunis in Marchienne. The two cone-shaped slagheaps Bayemont and Saint-Charles were worked for their residual coal in the 1990s and then transformed into a single unit. Trees and herbaceous plants were planted and spontaneous flora and fauna came to enhance the site's biodiversity.

Access from the top of rue du Chemin de Fer.



Le Bois du Cazier slagheaps at Marcinelle

Now refurbished as a museum, the UNESCOlisted former colliery is surrounded by three slagheaps.

The first, and the oldest one, is a flat, easily accessible slag heap from which you can see the coalmine site from a fresh perspective. The second, on which the outdoor theatre is based, is accessible through the Drève de la Mémoire, planted with 12 species of trees from the countries of origin of the victims of the 8 August 1956 tragedy. To reach the third slag heap, the highest, cone-shaped slag heap, you have to walk over an incredible overhead timber and metal footbridge overlooking the rue de la Gare. At the top, the landscape observatory, at an altitude of almost 250 metres, offers an exceptional 360° panoramic view of the entire region.

Access via rue du Cazier or rue de la Gare.

Piges slagheap at Dampremy


Climb to the top to discover the remains of mining activities and an incredible 360° view of the city, the ironworks and other slagheaps.

The sloping summit is rather difficult to reach, suitable footwear is necessary.

Access via rue Arthur Decoux at Dampremy.

SIGNPOSTED ROUTES ON THE SLAGHEAPS

"Terril Saint-Charles walking tour" at Marchienne

This 1.1 km accessible road leads gently up to the intermediate plateau of the Saint-Charles slag heap, where you will discover an old settling pond, dating from the 1990s, now filled with reeds. You are welcome to explore the surrounding dry grasslands in search of wild flowers and rare insects. The path then climbs gently upwards to the top from where you will have a magnificent view of the slagheap chain and the Marchienne ironworks.

The "Entre Fer, Charbon et Eau des Terrils" walking tour at Marchienne and Dampremy

A section of a route preceding the RAVeL network of greenways is an opportunity to warm yourself up before being led to a series of four slagheaps with an astonishing array of biodiversity: the Bayemont, the Saint-Charles, the Saint-Théodore Ancient and the Saint-Théodore Nouveau. From the top, you will enjoy an extraordinary panoramic view of the Porte Ouest iron and steelworks. The Saint-Théodore slag heap is the only one that is more challenging, but you will be up to the challenge if you do it step-by-step. It overlooks the Charleroi-Brussels canal, steelworks with a spectacular architectural design and other industrial landscapes much sought-after by photographers and film-makers.





THE BLACK ROUTE

A MUST-ATTEND CULTURAL ANNUAL EVENT (END OF APRIL), THE BLACK ROUTE IS ALSO WORTH VISITING THROUGHOUT THE YEAR.

GR of the Slagheaps or the GR412 path

Over 300 km long, this trail links Bernissart to Liège via Charleroi, La Louvière and Mons. An opportunity for many hikers to discover the remnants of Wallonia's distinguished mining legacy. Signposted by red and white paint strokes, the number refers to 4 December (4.12), the date on which the miners celebrated St Barbara's Day.

An additional 23-km near to the GR412

will appeal to the keenest hikers. Extending as far as Charleroi Station, it passes through scenic landmarks, such as the Marchienne and Monceau castles, the Martinet site and slagheaps, and the Dampremy and La Docherie slagheap chain.

The route includes climbing four slagheaps linked together by passages, paths and short sections of secondary roads. The signposting system consists of triangular slabs reminiscent of the shape of a slagheap.

PARKS AND WOODS

IN THE CITY CENTRE...

Oueen Astrid Park

An English park covering more than 2 ha, a crossing point between the upper and lower city areas. It boasts many outstanding exotic deciduous trees, including the Ginkgo Biloba, nicknamed "the 40 ecus tree", a price paid in the 17th century for this living fossil that was thought to have disappeared until that time. Various busts and statues bear witness to Charleroi's cultural activities and history.

Depelsenaire Park

Situated on the former army manoeuvres plain, between the Law Courts and the Commercial Court, this 72-acre green area is a park where all art lovers will enjoy taking a walk. It contains sculptures and contemporary works of art as well as stretches of water. History buffs will also be delighted to meet the lions of the former Law Courts, Totor and Tutur... nicknames affectionately attributed to the sons of the caretaker of the time, Nestor and Arthur.

AND ALL AROUND...

Nelson Mandela Park at Monceau-sur-Sambre

The four centuries-old common oak in the park is said to have witnessed the passage of Louis XIV's coach during his stay at the Château de Monceau in 1667, after Charleroi's fortress was captured. The part of the park facing the castle's south wing was designed in the French style, with parterres and geometric perspectives. The park's current scenic and landscaped appearance dates back to the 18th century fashion for English gardens. The park was renamed the Nelson Mandela Park, because its 67 hectares of land matches the number of years the struggle continued in South Africa.

Monceau Castle is a seigniorial residence dating back to the 17th and 18th centuries. Destroyed in 1554, it was rebuilt after 1607 to become the property of the Trazegnies, Hamal and Gâvre families. The 17th century gates provide access to the entrance pavilion, consisting of a porch and two wings ending in a tower. In the 19th century, the west wing was striking because of its classical layout, typical of the Louis XVI style. When this wing was added, a main courtyard was created with two 18th century pavilions on either side.

Serna Park at Jumet

Within its 16 semi-wild hectares, the park features outstanding native species such as a 150-year-old boxwood, a giant sequoia and an impressive bald cypress. Created in the English style in the 19th century, the park includes three splendid ponds.

Bivort Park at Jumet

Taking its name from the Bennert and Bivort glassworks, the park's landscaped appearance is very much in keeping with the English style. A teardrop-shaped stretch of water graces the site's central area, where many rare and noteworthy species grow: a white maple, a western red cedar and a silver maple, three of the most beautiful trees in Wallonia and Belgium, with a trunk measuring five metres twenty-five inches in circumference.

The municipal park at Châtelet

On the banks of a pond and a small brook, the admirable trees on display for visitors include silver lindens and exceptionally large copper beech trees, as well as exotic trees, rarely found in this part of the world. Children can also have fun in the three purpose-built playgrounds. Situated on a sunny slope, the communal orchard is home to 25 fruit trees, 218 shrubs and a flowery meadow covering the entire area.

Municipal Forest at Châtelet

This 200-hectare woodland is of major ecological, landscape and scenic value. Located in its centre, the listed Agouloir cave is one of the last places where bats can winter. Follow the signposted footpaths!

rue de la Justice, Châtelet

NATURE RESERVES

The Brun Chêne Nature Reserve at Mont-sur-Marchienne

Created on the site of two former limestone quarries near l'Eau d'Heure, the quarry also has an impressive industrial heritage with its small traditional-style lime kilns and monumental industrial kilns in which kestrels and jackdaws nest.

The site's dry or wet natural environment, the cliffs, the forest edges and its mining past have all contributed to the amazing array of biodiversity. The 16-ha quarry is home to several of the most endangered amphibian species in Wallonia, such as the natterjack toad and the common midwife toad, as well as three species of newts and frogs.

Extensive reedbeds have been home to a remarkable variety of birds in recent years, such as the reed warbler and the reed bunting as well as dragonflies. It is also home to the blue-winged grasshopper, a protected dryland species, and a noteworthy array of flora typical of limestone areas.

The Brun Chêne Nature Reserve is open to pedestrians, subject to certain conditions. They should respect the area by keeping to the footpaths and keeping their dogs on a leash. Please remember that you are not allowed to enter the reserve by bicycle or with any motorised vehicle, to deposit waste, to pick any plants or to make fires or barbecues.

The Bouffioulx and Châtelet Sebastopol Nature Reserve

Bordered by a unique variety of flora and fauna and covered by several paths, the reserve is an ideal place to discover a diverse range of plants and trees, insects, birds, birds of prey and bat species. The walking tour features a flooded quarry, lime kilns and the blue pond, the pride and joy of this reserve.

The Gouy-lez-Piéton Nature Reserve at Courcelles

Partly situated at Gouy-lez-Piéton and Chapelle-lez-Herlaimont, the reserve is home to four specific types of biotopes: wet meadows containing small ponds with a wealth of flora and fauna, a wooded area. dry meadows and a 40-are fir tree plantation.



The Viesville Nature Reserve at Pont-à-Celles

The reserve was created during construction work on the old Charleroi-Brussels canal in the 1950s, when sediments of various kinds were deposited randomly along the left bank of the canal. The reserve currently comprises almost 50 ha of forests and meadows, with more than 500 botanical species and 200 species of mushrooms.

The RAVeL line 1 "La Houillère"

offers an outstanding walking tour, practically established on its own site, which runs through the entire north-east part of Charleroi. The old 119 line (14 km long) is supplemented with a 6-km section on the old 122a line. "La Houillère" connects the two banks of the Basse-Sambre at Châtelet to those of the Charleroi-Brussels canal at Roux.

The RAVeL line 3

The towpaths offer cycling enthusiasts the opportunity to choose their own route.

The Sambre towpath joins Namur (53.3 km) or Thuin (23 km), while the towpath on the Charleroi-Brussels canal leads to Mons (55.4 km).

Bicycle routes

Several routes, created by the Province of Hainaut, also pass through Charleroi, in particular **the UNESCO Route in Hainaut** (Tournai-Mons La Louvière-Thuin-Charleroi) – **184 km** or **La Route Napoléon en Wallonie à vélo – 118 km**.

The themed route **"Friches, art urbain et patrimoine du Pays de Charleroi" - 25,6 km** - runs along the river Sambre, from Marchienne-au-Pont to Charleroi. The impressive industrial heritage along the river Sambre and the canal is becoming increasingly popular with foreign cycling tourists.

The second part of the route explores the city centre, where Street Art is also very prominent.

In Gerpinnes, the **15.9-km "Dans les pas des marcheurs de Sainte-Rolende route"** – takes tourists on the trail of the uniformed marchers carrying weapons who escort St. Rolende and St. Oger every Whit Monday. The route gives prominence to views of open landscapes, typical village centres and forest paths.
